

TOOL SHOP KEEPER



Job title: Construction Worker

Reports to: Site Manager

Job purpose: To work within the construction team in the build up to a festival, carrying out a wide range of jobs to ensure the smooth and safe running of the event.

Responsibilities:

- Help with designing and building projects and structures for the festival whilst ensuring health and safety is the top priority.
- Stock take and relay to site manager when stock is depleted.
- Maintain and repair various workshop tools.
- Ensure working areas are tidy and return all equipment at the end of the day.
- Inspect site and builds to ensure they are fit for use.
- Must be willing to work very long hours with breaks taken where they can be according to the needs of the event to make sure the job is done.
- Flexibility and adaptability is key; able to work in all weathers whilst staying safety focused.
- You should be able to follow instruction yet be a creative problem solver when required.
- Must be willing to work with large groups and be able to mix easily with different teams.
- Above all applicants must be helpful and approachable, with a good sense of humour. This is a very friendly workplace and we want people to enjoy their time of the farm.
- You may be required to carry out other duties, as are within your capabilities and level of responsibility, in order to meet the needs of the festival.
- You should be ready to work hard, long hours. It's worth it though, honest
- This is a pre festival role with regular trips to the farm required, however a limited amount of over the weekend applications in return for a ticket will be considered for the right applicant. Ideally, but not essentially, if the event requires, some pre festival candidates would be willing to do a shift over the weekend itself.
- During the week of the festival, all pre event crew will be required to be available and onsite from Saturday 18th July – Monday 27th July, though the work will be divided into shifts.
- You may be invited to occasional planning meetings in Herefordshire and the festival is based just outside Bromyard, Herefordshire for dates 24th – 26th July 2015.

Essential:

- No official qualifications are required for the role but construction experience is essential, with a reasonable competence of construction tools and knowledge of safe working practices. Candidates must have their own basic PPE

Desirable:

- First Aid training and a driving license desirable but not essential.

- Cover travel and other reasonable expenses incurred as part of your role with the festival.
